Our marking and feedback framework is built around three key principles: it should be meaningful, manageable, and motivating. These strands ensure that feedback has a clear purpose, supports student progress, is sustainable for teachers and students, and encourages learners to take ownership of their development.

IB	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Exam-style questions Past paper questions Exit Tickets 	At least one written formative feedback every fortnight.	Unit-based (recorded)

- Verbal feedback
- Online Maths education platforms
- Peer/self-assessment
- Cold-call questioning
- Mini-whiteboard activities
- Live marking during circulation
